SUBJECT: DELAY IN IMPLEMENTATION OF NEW TEMPORARY LABORATORY PANEL CODES UNTIL JANUARY 1, 1998

ATTENTION MEDICARE BUSINESS OFFICE MANAGER: Please distribute to all appropriate health care facility personnel.

General Medicare Bulletin G-284, dated May 16, 1997, announced the new laboratory panel that were approved during the American Medical Association (AMA) Current Procedural Terminology (CPT) November, 1996 board meeting. It also published the Health Care Financing Administration's (HCFA) new temporary procedure codes assigned for reporting of the new laboratory panels (i.e., G0095, G0096, G0097 and G0098).

The purpose of this bulletin is to advise providers that HCFA has delayed the implementation of these codes until <u>January 1, 1998</u>. The delay of this implementation will also eliminate the need to utilize the temporary procedure codes (i.e., G0095, G0096, G0097 and G0098). However, HCFA's instructions in General Medicare Bulletin G-284, pertaining to the elimination of multi-channel laboratory test (i.e., 80002 through 80019 and G0058 through G0060) as HCPCS codes effective for services performed on and after January 1, 1998, is still in effect. Providers should ensure that they review and make the necessary changes in their business office operation to comply with these guidelines which will, as well as the new laboratory panels, take effect January 1, 1998.
